



Gothic 'TellTale' Rosé 2013 Edition

Gothic is proud to announce its latest Rosé release from Oregon's Willamette Valley named after the thrilling Edgar Allan Poe story, The Tell-Tale Heart. This wine is an assemblage of estate Pinot Noir and Chardonnay fruit in similar proportions to fine rosé Champagne. With a pale pink color and bracing acidity, it is the perfect complement to warm summer days and dining al fresco.

Vineyard Information

Gothic 'TellTale' Rosé is made from fruit from the historic Hyland Vineyard which was planted in 1971, just five years after Pinot Noir was introduced to Oregon's Willamette Valley. Planted with rare and prized own-rooted, old vine Pinot Noir and Chardonnay, the vineyard lies exposed to cool maritime winds and coastal influences via the Van Duzer corridor break in Oregon's coastal range. Elevations of 600-800 feet and the volcanic soils of the McMinnville sub-AVA provide ideal growing conditions for the vines to ripen with balance and grace.

Tasting Notes

Aromas of wild strawberries and rosewater are echoed on the palate by wild red berry fruits and watermelon, buttressed by refreshing, mouth-watering acidity akin to biting into a fresh granny smith apple - a true Gothic Wine.
